Good afternoon sir. This is Jacqueline. I wish to have an interview with you.

Good afternoon madam. Most welcome. I'm Mr. Lakshmaiah, Principal, A.P.S.W.R. Junior College, which provides IIT-JEE/ NEET/ EAMCET long term coaching for Social Welfare Residential students, at Gowlidoddi, Ranga Reddy dist.

When was this college established?

In 1998 by Mr. D.R.Garg, I.A.S. the former Secretary of A.P.S.W.R.E.I.S, under the guidance of Sri Chukka Ramaiah, IIT-JEE coaching advisor.

What are the courses available in our college and the Medium of Instruction?

MPC and BPC through English medium.

How many seats are available and how many sections are there?

There are 8 sections, and 40 students in each section. Jr. MPC (2), Sr. MPC (2), Jr. BPC (2), Sr. BPC (2). One section for boys and one section for girls. This is a co-education college. There 8 sections in all. 4 for boys and 4 for girls. We admit 40 students per section.

What is the admission process?

During the month of January, APSWREIS gives a notification for conducting ENTRANCE TEST for admissions into our college. Tenth class students are eligible to write this entrance test, which

normally is held in the month of March and the results are declared in the month of April.

Who are eligible for this entrance test?

Students belonging to SC, ST., BC and OC of APSWREIS, and other students who belong to SC- category of other schools who score above 60% in their half-yearly examinations held by their respective schools are eligible.

You said that the institution was started in 1998, May I know how many of them got settled and how many of them are pursuing higher studies?

As far as I know, 45 of them completed their studies and are settled abroad & in India. Right now 87 of them are in different IIT's; 115 students are in NIT's; and more than 300 students have joined in Premier Engineering colleges in A.P.

I think this is an incredible journey, leading the students into a world of their dreams.

This is a collective effort and team work of the staff, and encouragement given by the officers of APSWREIS. It is an unending endeavor by the principals of different institutions and the teachers who have identified and nurtured the talents of their students. The readiness of parents in co-operating with us paved way to be on par with the upcoming private/corporate colleges.

They are now capable of organizing different activities by inspiring other girls who didn't undergo this camp. They are able to take care of themselves and their younger sisters too in the schools. In fact they work as mentors in solving the problems of others too. Their personal hygiene, their living standands, their outlook as girls, good manners, behavior, etc. has improved, witness the teachers.



Sri. C. Siddhardhana Reddy, Joint Secretary opines after a few of his visits to the schools, I have noticed certain amount of improvement in the conduct of the children. THE NEED FOR SHORT ACTIVITIES IN CLASS ROOM

While preparing main component of your lesson, you still find some extra ingredients to make it into a smooth, integrated unit. You may need, for example:

- A quick warm-up for the beginning to get your students into the right mood for learning.
- An idea for a brief vocabulary review before starting a new text.
- 3. A light filler to provide relief after a period of intense effort and concentration.
- A brief orientation activity to prepare a change of mood or topic.
- A game or amusing item to round off the lesson with a smile.

Besides, contributing the routine lesson planning, you may find these short activities can be of use in non-routine situations as well. These activities will be helpful to you when you have to fill in for another teacher and need some quick-easily prepared ideas for instant use. The short-activities in classroom help a group of students to know one another or keeping them profitably busy and engaged when you are unexpectedly busy in administrative affairs. Teachers also find short activities which can be used to provide a smooth transition between two major parts of a lesson and to supplement a course book in general.

The process of each activity should follow the guidelines mentioned as under.

a) The present teaching procedure which we consider


- are of genuine learning value for the students. But the short activities in our lesson design would be mere time-fillers or that keep students occupied during something profitless. Even in brief, enjoyable activities the students can continue to learn, increase knowledge and improve thinking.
- b) In most cases, activity are suitable for a variety of levels, from elementary to advanced. The teachers, probably the best judge of the appropriacy of an activity for your students.
- c) Timing: The activities you wish to develop in a longer lesson component should not be more than five minutes of lesson time.
- d) Preparation: The activities demand minimum preparation before it is actually conducted. Usually all you have to do is leaf through the course book and decide which idea you want to use as an activity. List out and procure the material like worksheets, pencil, crayons, colour pieces of chalk, charts, fevicol, gum tapes, sheets of rough paper etc., before the activity is conducted during the development of lesson.
- e) Integrating the activities into the lesson: Try to link each short activity with what has gone before, or what is coming after, in topic is worth making your lesson explicit.

I hope you enjoy in designing activities in classroom teaching to suit different levels of abilities of learners.

New School for Boys @ Chintalapudi

In accordance with the G.O. Rt. No.105, Planning (XVIII) Department, dated 21-01-2012, a new school for boys had been sanctioned at Kanepada village of Chintalapudimandal. evidence of his inner urge for reform. He emphasises and persuades the pedagogy as well as the pupils to learn English as he foresees the benefits of learning it, not because he has no love for his vernacular.

He himself is an eloquent ora-

tor, if necessity arises.

Praveen plans elaborately to elicit those creative skills that are inherently concealed in the children. He is aware of the potential abilities of the children. Therefore he drills deep developments with all types of training programmes. Bullets only pierce and don't reappear, you know. II. Using Your Text book

- A. Don't expect your Teacher/Lecturer to give you detailed, page by page textbook assignments. While some may do so, many do not. College Lecturers are much more likely to expect you to use your own initiative in making use of the text.
- B. In most cases, it will be most useful for you to at least skim the relevant chapters before each lecture(i.e., CDF-Concepts Definitions & Formulae). You should receive a course outline/syllabus at the beginning of the quarter, which will tell you the subject for each day. You may receive chapter references (or even page references), or you instructor may expect you to be perceptive enough to refer to the Table of Contents.
- When you first approach a chapter, page through it fairly quickly, noting boldface headings and subheadings, examining figures, illustrations, charts, etc., and thinking about any highlighted vocabulary terms and concepts. Also take note of the pedagogical aids at the end of the chapterstudy questions, summary, etc.
- 2. When you have finished surveying the chapter, return to the beginning and read in more detail. Remember to concentrate upon understanding. Don't simply read through the words. Any words which you don't understand you should look up. If you own the book and intend to keep it, you may want to write definitions of such words in the margins. You may also find it helpful to make observations and other useful notes in the margins. If you don't intend to keep the book yourself, you should carry out similar activities on a page in your class notebook.
- On this first trip through the chapter, you should concentrate upon catching the major subjects and points of the material. Also take note of those things which you don't understand. If the lecture

on the material doesn't clarify those points, you should askyour Lecturer to explain.

- C. Following coverage of the chapter's material in class, you should go back to the book and read it again. It will probably be helpful to skim through it first, as you did when you first looked at it. The tables and figures should be more readily read in detail. If you are a truly conscientious student, you will outline the chapter and prepare a vocabulary list of the terms which are pertinent.
- D. At this time you should think seriously about the review and study questions at the end of the chapter. Do your best to answer all of them as if they were a take-home exam.
- E. You may also want to develop a system of cross referencing symbols to use when comparing your class notes to your notes from the text.
- F. Remember that your instructor will probably not use the same words which you find in the text book. nothing is more frustrating than to discover that what you hear in class is no more than a rehash of what you read in the book. However, if your Lecturer knows his/her subject, and the author of your text knows his/her subject, the meat of what they say should be the same.

NOTE: Nobody is infallible. Your Lecturer may make mistakes. Don't expect him or her to be more than human.
