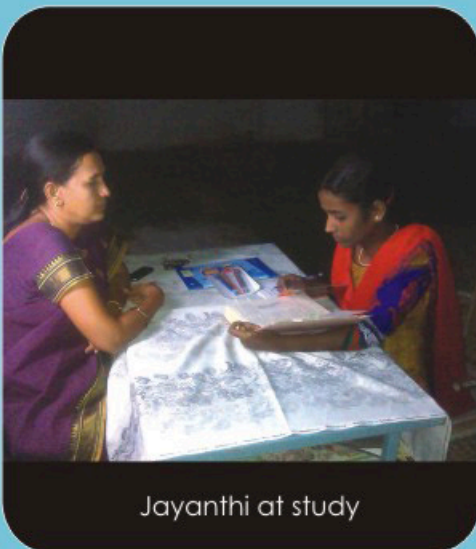

When teachers are selfless, make sacrifices to foster worthy and deserving students, miracles happen. Teachers, thus can transform dust into stardust; pebbles to diamonds.

What’s the role of a teacher at a deeper and different level? There’re millions of teachers in the world. But how many of them go beyond the role of a teacher and embrace the role of a mother?

We’ve here Kanya Kumari, a teacher of Social Welfare Residential School in Chittoor dist. Her feelings, her tone, her thinking, her approach, her treat are genuinely that of a MOTHER.

Mrs. Kanya Kumari says that she has two daughters. The first is her biological one who has finished her MBBS. The second, P. Jayanthi is not her biological one. Yet Kanya Kumari loves and claims her as her own. Jayanthi is the daughter of poor and illiterate parents. Incidentally Jayanthi happened to be a student of APSWRS/JC, Satyaveedu, Chittoor dist, where Mrs. Kanya Kumari was a teacher.

P. Jayanthi finds a mother in Kanya Kumari. She no more feels that she is unwanted, unloved, uncared for. Even if her parents abandon her, there’s someone in APSWREI Society to look after her needs.

Now read Kanya Kumar is candid narration of her affinity for Jayanthi. **- Dr. KF Reddy**

My name is P. Kanya Kumari and I was working as Vice principal in APSW Residential Jr. College, Satyaveedu, Chittoor dist. I happened to see in the school P. Jayanthi D/o P. Masthaniah from Varadayapalem, Chittoor dist. Although physically challenged (cerebral palsy) with shaking limbs and hearing defect, she was determined to make a mark in her academic career. I was so moved by her persistent academic efforts. Not only her determination aroused the teacher in me, but also stimulated my maternal instincts for her. I got attached to her gradually and supported her in every way I could think of. I accompanied her to various counseling sessions at NTR Health University. Jayanthi is the first literate in her family.

‘P. Jayanthi is not disabled, she’s only differently abled’, I say.

Ever since I was associated with APSWREIS for providing quality life to the poor and deprived students through free education, I’ve seen several pathetic situations where children are never given an opportunity to prove their worth. In several cases obstacles came in the form of parents who were unwilling and least bothered about their children’s future. They wanted to throw their children into earnings even at a tender age of ten.

In some cases children lack true guidance and support due to poverty and illiteracy. This is the case where several talented children can’t explore their opportunity just because they are unaware of their inborn talents.

However constant counseling is required to boost them through day-to-day challenges. We need to make them believe that

“The richest aren’t the ones who always win...the ones who never give up when they fail”.

I feel that what I have achieved is really nothing compared to what I want to.

Jayanthi could grab the attention of other teachers of her class too. We made her sit in the front row in her IPE classes so that she feels more focused. She secured first class with a distinction of 89% in Intermediate. Later I strongly supported her idea of attending EAMCET coaching at Gowlidoddi for 45 days. I was fully confident that she would secure a place in medicine. I was keen on selecting her for the camp. It was a wonderful opportunity that our Secretary had provided. Her persistent hard work delighted all of us. She got an admission into the Medical College, S.V. University. We are all very proud of her success. Now we hope that she will do her best to make a mark in her medical career. My daughter who’s a doctor provides her books and other assistance. Our compassionate Secretary, Dr. Praveen Kumar too has extended adequate financial help to meet other expenses.

We wish her all the very best and may God bless her in every way.

also physically challenged.**

**A frail person due to cerebral palsy
but not weak in determination
with a goal in mind to reach and
to save and strengthen her family
of four sisters and a brother ...**

I don't want to be a burden to my poor parents, who are labourers with five daughters. So I came to Secretary to seek financial help. Without my asking, he himself has offered me great help. How can I repay him?

Could you narrate your childhood.

I hail from Varadayapalem, village of Chittoor dist. My parents are Padma and Mastaniah. They are mere labourers. I have four sisters and a brother.

What about your primary education?

I had attended the Govt. school in my village from 1st std to 10th.

How did you happen to enter SWR Jr. College?

Although I knew about SWR schools, I was unable to join in it for High School education due to ill health. Moreover, my parents were not willing to admit me in a residential school away from them. They took care of me until tenth class. But after tenth, I expressed my willingness and assured them I would be able to manage. So, with the help of school teachers, I was able to seek admission into SWR Jr. College at Satyaveedu, Chittoor dist. I took BPC group deliberately in order to try for Nursing.

You have neurotic defect. How did the teachers at Satyaveedu treat you?

I should offer my deep gratitude to all the teachers, and especially to Smt. K. Kanya Kumari teacher. She took extreme care of me. Teachers put me in the front bench as my hearing was partially improved. semi-deaf. Life at Satyaveedu college is memorable. I had no difficulties at all. I was happy studying there. I received all amenities and excellent treatment. Although I suffered homesickness in the beginning, I became comfortable later due to fine atmosphere there.

You wanted to go for Nursing. But how have you gone for Medicine?

It's absolutely the plan of Kanya Kumari lecturer. She was my mentor. She encouraged telling that I would definitely get admission into medicine. It's she that transformed my idea. She spoke to my parents and sent me to the 'Mega EAMCET' coaching camp held by the APSWREI Society for 45 days at Gowlidoddi. I received full guidance and comprehended the concept of Medicine there. The camp was a big benefit to me. I secured 21612th rank. I offer profuse thanks to the Society and the officers who devised that camp.

Did you expect a call for counseling?

Of course, I did. I wrote the entrance test well. Today (12th Sep) I

attended the counseling held at Osmania Medical College, Hyderabad. I'm extremely excited for getting this admission and my father's joy is boundless. All this credit goes first to my mentor, Smt. K. Kanya Kumari, now the Principal of Valmikipuram; and, secondly to the APSWREI Society.

What type of help have you received at the EAMCET camp?

Lodging and boarding; coaching; books; other miscellaneous expenditure was all free. Besides, the care, encouragement and treatment given to the students was remarkable. Especially the talks on 'MINDSET' was highly impressive and inspiring. It had instilled abundant confidence in me. Continuous tests and grand tests also helped me a lot.

What's your goal now?

I don't want to be a burden to my poor parents, who are labourers with five daughters. So I came to Secretary to seek financial help. Without my asking, the society has offered me great help. How can I repay him?

He received me with all smiles. He listened to my story and sanctioned me Rs.50,000/- toward initial expenses on par with IIT students. He has encouraged and blessed me.

The following is an extract from the exclusive interview of parents and the child for SWAEROES journal.

Welcome dear parents, could you brief us about yourselves?

Sir, we are proud to be interviewed because of Prasanna who stands first in her studies. I do designing and rolling for clothes while my wife rolls beedies. With our meager earnings we are eking out our living. We have three daughters and the eldest had also studied here, Prasanna is the second one. We hope to admit our third child too here. We never regretted having three daughters for they are all hard working.

What prompted you to admit your children here in the APSWRS?

I learnt about it from my neighbours and admitted my two daughters here in standard V. Our first daughter had also been an alumna of this school. we strongly feel that APSWR institutions offer the best education and care for the disadvantaged.

As parents, what is it that makes you feel happy about the APSWRS?

Quite enthusiastic activities have been taking place in our institutions for the several months now. They all aim at bringing out the latent talents in us. E-Plus Club, Reading Club and Youth Parliament are not only useful but also boosting confidence in us. 'Ten commandments' in the prayer teaches us to be honest and fearless.

In what activities have you actively participated?

I am impressed by three things: E-Plus Club, Youth Parliament and Voice for Girls. Though I am in Telugu medium, I am a regular speaker in the E-Plus Club. It was heavily pouring ... no sign of its ceasing! All arrangements were thoroughly done. We were only to wait for the SWAEROES. It was beyond 9 am. The program ought to have begun. The Swaeroes kept calling from buses and trains. The only hurdle was bad weather. It delayed the journey of the Swaeroes who were on their way from distant places.

But the spirit of SWAEROES kept soaring into Infinity. No floods could prevent them from reaching the venue. Gradually the auditorium was jam-packed. Many Swaeroes had to stand in the corridors. The animators played a vital role, keeping everything under control. The 'SWAEROES DAY' testifies this fact. To our surprise more than 2000 Swaeroes converged from all parts of the state at Ravindra bhārathi (auditorium), Hyderabad on **25th October to celebrate the 'Swaeroes Day'** in commemoration of the birthday of (Late) Sri. The "Super Student Lecture" over Mana TV has been launched on 1st November. The first to embrace the role of a teacher and present a lecture is Kumari D. TEACHERS' SUPPORT FOR V 4 G

I feel enthralled to express my views on the wonderful programme VOICE 4 GIRLS conducted from 06-09-2013 to 08-09-2013 on behalf of all the teachers I would like to thank, Dr. Praveen Kumar IPS, the honorable secretary of APSWREI, for giving us a wonderful opportunity for acquainting us with innovative, fun based, kinesthetic, auditory, visual and far beyond the conventional methods of teaching. I feel privileged to be a part of this wonderful programme for the second time because I had been a part of VOICE 4 GIRLS SUMMER LEADERSHIP CAMP. The various strategies taught in the training programme are as follows:



K. VILLASTILES, RT. English

1. **Chit Treasure Hunt:** It involves group work and infuses movement and excitement in the students.
2. **Brain Storm:** Gives a wider scope to think a particular topic in various dimensions.
3. **Carousel:** The Students are made to stand in two concentric circles with a partner facing each other. The two circles will move alternatively which gives a scope to multiple ideas and getting different prospective.
4. **Snowball:** It starts with a pair or trio after completion of the task. Each pair or trio would find another pair or trio to exchange ideas. It helps in exploring ideas.
5. **Gallery Critique:** It is a sort of positive feedback wherein the groups or individuals hang their work on the walls and the other participants give a feed back by leaving a note on a sticking note. It gives a chance to assimilate feed back without taking the criticism too personally.
6. **Agree/ Disagree:** The board is divided into half. The halves will be labeled agree/disagree. Then the facilitator would read out some sentences. If the students agree with the statement they would throw the paper balls towards agree. If they disagree they would throw towards disagree.
7. **Rotating Papers:** It is somewhat related to gallery critique. The work done by individuals or groups would add their comments. This continues until the original group gets their own piece of work back. This again helps in positive feedback.
8. **Role-Play:** Role plays make ideas real for many different kinds of learners.
9. **Group Discussions:** This helps them to get as many different perspectives as possible.
10. **Matching:** It involves matching two corresponding pieces of information together.
11. **Jigsaw:** Divide the children into different groups. These will be their home groups. Each person from a home group go around and learn something new and then come back and teach their home what they have learned to help them solve a problem. Then each person in a home group is assigned an expert group. People from each home group join their expert group and learn some aspect of the topic from material provided.
12. **Headlines:** This technique helps them to summarize what they have learned into a short headline. This helps in quick recapitulation of the topic taught.
13. **Interview Technique:** The participants interview each other to try and find a predetermined set of answers. This helps students to identify the types of questions they need to ask to get the answers they need.
14. **Campaign:** The Students summarize a day of learning through slogans, logos and posters and represent these using art materials. When they are done with it, they carry out a campaign. It helps them explore the topic creatively.
15. **Micro teaching:** In this activity the participants present lessons or activities to their peers. It helps the students try new techniques and ideas.

I wish the society organize many programmes like the above in future.

How did you get this idea of launching a Newspaper?

Our students have been reading 'The Hindu, student edition' since last year. They used to send answers to puzzles or quiz etc.. and wait eagerly to see their name in print. But it has not happened.

At the same time Our 'SWAEROES' magazine inspired us. With this inspiration we launched our own Newspaper.

How do you generate the content?

All the celebrations, special occasions and incidents in our school, in the district and in our Society provide the content. The students and Staff also contribute Articles, Puzzles, Poems etc..

It's a fortnight news letter, I believe. When did you begin and how many issues have you circulated so far?

Yes, we planned it as a fortnight news letter. We wanted to launch the first issue on 15/8/2013. But as our Secretary was busy then, We postponed it to 20/8/2013. Even then unfortunately, Secretary couldn't visit us. So due to some inevitable circumstances, we had to launch it. So far we released two editions and third is getting ready.

How expensive is it?

Each copy costs around Rs.15/-

How do you generate fund for it?

For the first issue we (I, TGT English, PD & HS) contributed Rs.500/- each. We announced this to the students during the launching of the first issue. Then the students told us that they also wish to be a part of it. Now they are contributing Rs.2/- each every month.

Who are the people who play vital role in preparing it?

The three of us, TGT (English) Padmaja, P.D, Sheshu kumari and I, look after this. All the staff members also contribute articles etc and the computer assistant are also very helpful to us.

How many copies do you prepare for each issue?

We prepared around 90 copies of the first issue and 50 copies of the second issue.

How is the response of readers?

We have an excellent response so far. Our Secretary is impressed very much. He appreciated us for this creativity. The dignitaries who were present during the launching of CHIRP N CHALK were thrilled. They said that this kind of activity in a government Institution is really great. The reporters of Sakshi and Namaste Telangana visited our school during lunch one day. They too were impressed by our News paper and F.M Radio very much. An article was published in the centre page of SAKSHI District Edition about these activities. On seeing this, reporters from 8 T.V Channels visited our school, recorded our activities and appreciated us a lot. The response of our students is overwhelming.

Are you satisfied with the content contribution so far?

Ans:- Yes, Very much.

By the way, you have also discovered an in-house radio. Who is the inspiration behind it?

Ans:- Our students have a busy schedule from 5 am to 9 pm. We couldn't find time to talk to them, to all the students at a time, or to provide some entertainment. Moreover, Last year i.e in OCT/2013, because of some unwanted incidents, our students were disturbed. We were always thinking of different ways to bring them back to normalcy and to remove unhealthy thoughts from their minds, if there are any. One day while we (I, P.D and TGT (English)) were discussing this, the idea of F.M radio struck us. We discussed it at length and tried it out. We ourselves conducted the programme that day. Our students were thrilled so much that we continued this programme.

How do you make use of the radio?

Ans :- First of all this radio helps the students to relax without wasting their time, while having their food. We conduct the programme from 1.15 pm to 1.45 pm and 6.30 pm to 7.00 pm i.e during lunch and dinner. If there are any special instructions /announcements, we give them through our F.M radio. We found that the students are more disciplined during lunch and dinner now.

Could you give a brief description of the role of students in making it?

Ans :- This programme is exclusively conducted by the students.

What type of programs do you run over your radio ?

Ans:- They sing songs, tell jokes, share their feelings of happiness and sorrow, talk about their classroom activities, send birthday wishes and talk about the food etc..

There was some indiscipline in the school before you took charge. Now all seem to be peaceful and smooth. What could be the reasons of disturbances and how are you able to put things in order?

You are right! There was some disturbance in the institution on 3rd & 4th October 2012. Our Secretary visited the institution and sent

the principal on leave. Panic prevailed among the students when I took charge. We had to struggle a lot to put things in order.

Our efforts were manifold. On one hand we gave constant counseling to the students – boosting them separately and in groups. We spent time with the students from 5am to 11pm. Teachers even sat in front of the dormitory throughout the night to develop confidence among the students.

On the other hand, I tried to solve emergency problems like water and power supply. We got the starters of two bores repaired and bought a bundle of electric wire and arranged lighting everywhere. Smt. Ch. Vijaylakshmi, NRI donated an RO Water plant through Rotary Seva Trust. Mr. Sanyasi Rao, Mr. Shiva kumar and Mr. Desai interacted with the students and counseled to them. We looked after the students carefully till the quarterly exams were over. This was the first phase.

In the second phase, I spoke to the parents who were mostly arrogant and reckless. I counseled them also. Whenever there was some trouble either from the parents or from outsiders, I used to call our Secretary and follow his directions. Ultimately we were able to convince the parents and made them realize the change.

I was given the complete charge on 26/10/2012 and our efforts continued. Mr. Hanmantha Raya, Chairman, National SC, ST Commission visited our school. While certain people tried to complain about the school, he said that we have just started our efforts and he expressed his optimistic opinion of our endeavours. Meanwhile Secretary too sent Psychologists like Mr. Balakrishna; and Alumni Associations, Mr. Dilip Kumar Asst. Professor Central University and Ms. Roja Lakshmi Research Scholar to counsel the students. These people boosted our morale and helped us to mould our students in a better manner. I always told the students that we have to be successful in every aspect that we undertake. Through our FM Radio and Chirp N Chalk we tried to extract the hidden creative talents of our students and assist them appropriately. Gradually, we were able to win their trust. Now that they have realized the need for progress, we hope that they will continue to do well.

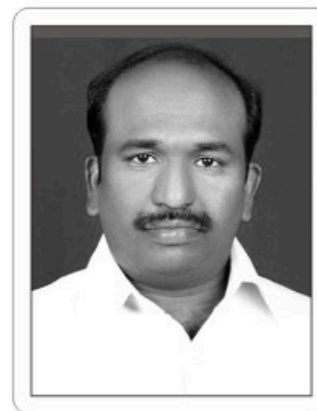

IV. Some Final Suggestions

- A. You should receive a syllabus for each class. This is the Rule Book for that class
(in our classes, we call it the Integrated Micro Schedule). Know everything on that syllabus! Your teacher has the right to expect you to know and abide by any rules and stipulations on that document, and it is perfectly within his/her rights to penalize you for failing to do so. Respect dates and deadlines, and expect to lose points if you turn things in late.
- B. Never miss an exam if you can help it. You will rarely be more ready for the exam in two or three days than you are on the scheduled date, and the annoyance the teacher will feel about having to arrange a special exam time for you can actually hurt your grade in the end. Miss exams only if you absolutely have to.
- C. Save everything. Never throw away a handout or a returned assignment or exam. With this in mind, equip yourself with a pouched folder for each class.
- D. Develop systematic behavior patterns associated with your schoolwork.
 1. Keep your class materials together and neat.
 2. Never allow yourself to be caught at school without the necessary notebooks and materials. If you develop systematic habits with respect to attending classes, etc., this will be no problem.
- E. It is excellent practice to set aside a study area at home, and to designate a particular span of time each day as study time. However, don't fall into the trap of feeling that study should never exceed the preordained time limits. You put in as much study time as is necessary to master the material for your classes.

She looked around her home and found a few glass, metal and plastic beads, an old golden shoes lace of her dolls, and of course as she was gazing intently at this 'junk' collection, she realized she also had an old silver pendant and suddenly she assembled them to see a lovely chain that perfectly matched her dress!

Talking about her passion which started at school level, Esha says beads are her obsession. She graduated out of NIFT, Gandhinagar in 2011 from the Accessory Program, specialising in Jewellery Design. She is a freelance jewellery designer collaborating with multiple projects. One of her interests is designing in beads. Esha designed her own bead jewellery when in school and for her friends, and her love for it led her into making jewellery design her career.

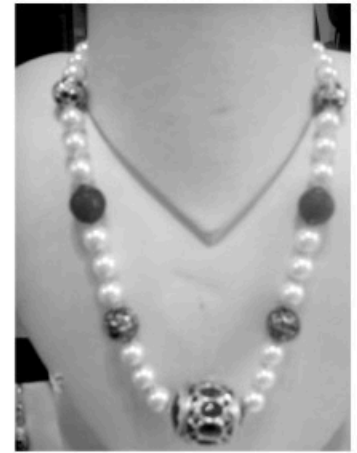

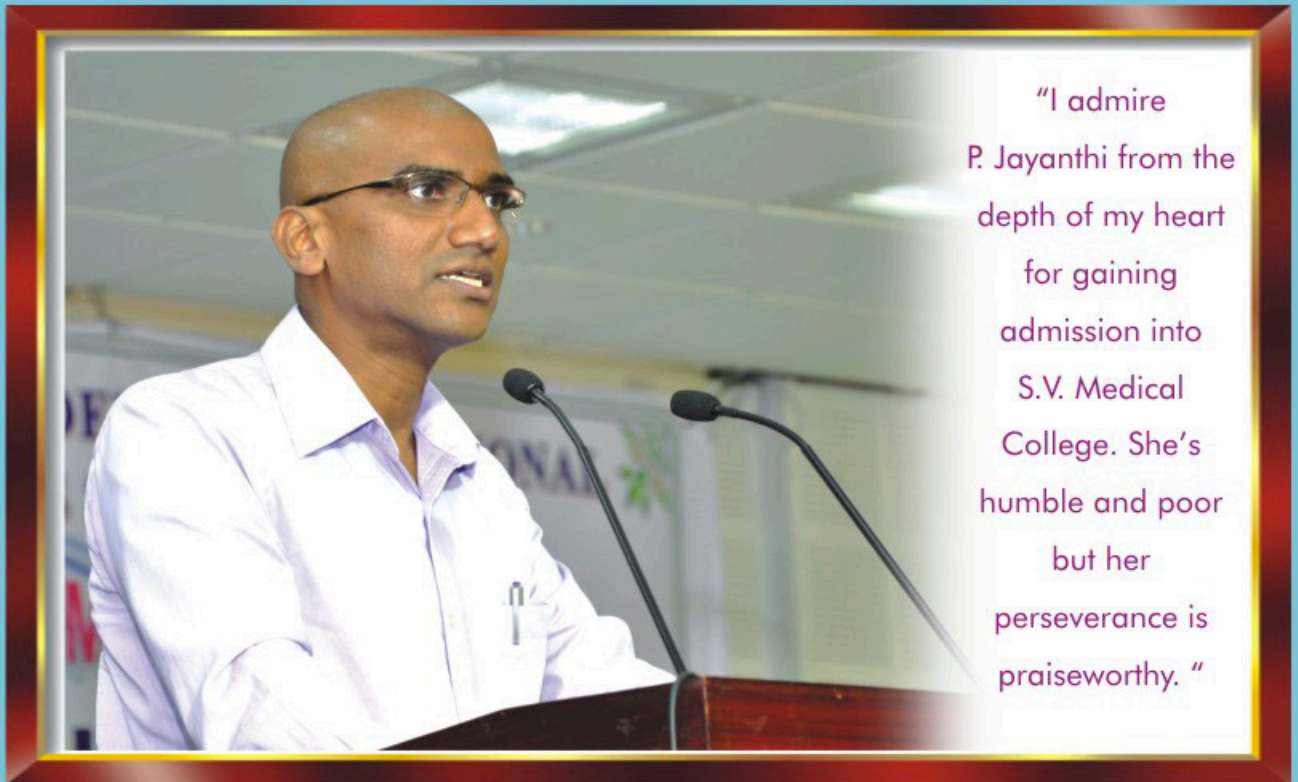

1	Bharat Ratna	The highest civilian Award of the country was instituted in the year 1954. Any person without distinction of race, occupation, position or sex is eligible for these awards.
2	Padma Awards	Padma Shri is awarded for 'distinguished service'; Padma Bhushan for 'distinguished service of a high order'; and Padma Vibhushan for 'exceptional and distinguished service.
3	Rajiv Gandhi KhelRatna Award	India's highest honour given for achievement in sports.
4	Arjuna Award	Recognizes outstanding achievement in National sports.
5	Dronacharya Award	An award presented by the government of India for excellence in sports coaching.
6	Dhyan Chand Award	India's highest award for lifetime achievement in sports and games. The award is named after the legendary Indian hockey player Dhyan Chand.
7	ParamVir Chakra	Highest military award for valour, equivalent to the Victoria Cross (which it replaced once India gained its independence).
